

# A Message from our Rector

Everyone, I suspect, is in favour of forgiveness, at least in principle. “Everyone,” C.S. Lewis writes, “says forgiveness is a lovely idea, until there is something to forgive” Mere Christianity p.115. What do we do then? What do we do when there is something to forgive?

Forgiveness is the only way forward. That does not mean we forget, condone, or approve of what was done. It does not mean we ignore or excuse cruelty or injustice. It means we are released from them. We let go of the thoughts and fantasies of revenge. We look to the future rather than the past. We try to see and love as God sees and loves us. Forgiveness is a way in which we align our life with God’s life.

God’s forgiveness and human forgiveness are integrally related. That is more than apparent in today’s parable. The king forgives his slave an extraordinary amount. Ten thousand talents is about 3000 years of work at the ordinary daily wage. It seems there is no debt too large to be forgiven. This man, this debtor, was forgiven. That’s what the kingdom of heaven is like. That’s how our God is. This slave, however, refused to forgive his fellow slave 100 denarii, about three months of work at the ordinary daily wage. Too often that’s what our world is like. Frequently, it is how we are. In that refusal the forgiven slave lost his own forgiveness.

This should not be news to us. We acknowledge and pray it every Sunday and probably every day. “Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.” We pray those words with ease and familiarity but do we live our prayer? “Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times.”
