You will see that the **Stations of the Cross** posters are now



up in Church. These **Stations of the Cross** are painted by Sieger Köder (1925-2015), a German artist and Catholic priest whose life and work were shaped by faith and the experience of WW2. His series of the Stations of the Cross, often titled *The Folly of Christ*, explores the mystery of the cross through the words of St Paul. Köder's work encourages us to slow down, to look more deeply, and to encounter the story of Christ in the realities of our own lives. You can look through them yourselves (with an accompanying pamphlet – found in Church) or you can join us on Good Friday between 2 and 3pm for a meditation on the Stations of the Cross.
